Adults: (Singles, College, Newlyweds, Empty Nesters, etc.)

1. What are some ways we can take seriously the command of Genesis 1:28 to rule wisely over the world God has given us?
2. How will you change the way you relate to others (family, friends, enemies, outcasts, the lost) in light of the image of God that we share?
3. How can our rhythm of work and rest support our witness to the gospel of Jesus Christ?

Students: (Grades 6th-12th)

1. Why is it important for our family to understand that God created everything in His image?
2. How might knowing that you were created in God's image help you better understand Him?
3. Why is it important that we reflect God in the way we work?
4. In what ways can our family do better at reflecting the image of God to others?

Children: (K-5th Grade)

1. How did God create Adam and Eve? (See Genesis 1:26–2:25.)
2. What does it mean to be created in God's image? (We have qualities similar to God like being wise, loving, and creative; but we are not God. He is all knowing, ever compassionate, and the Creator.)
3. How can you and your family recognize God's image in each other this week?

Preschool:

1. Why are people more special than anything else God made?
2. What does it mean to be made in God's image?
3. Why did God make people in His own image?
