



June 25, 2017: The Plagues, the Passover, and the Crossing of the Red Sea

Adults: (Singles, College, Newlyweds, Empty Nesters, etc.)

1. What are some things we learn as we walk by faith in God's guidance?
2. How do we give glory to God by obeying His instructions, even when we don't understand His purpose?
3. Write an expression of praise to God for His deliverance from sin and judgment that comes through faith in the work of Jesus Christ. With whom might you share about your faith in Him?

Students: (Grades 6th-12th)

1. How does our family respond to stress? Are we quick to worry and complain, or do we immediately trust God? Explain.
2. When have we been able to look back and see how God has guided our family? How does that help us trust Him with the future?
3. What is the appropriate response to God's protection and intervention in difficult circumstances? In what ways can our family improve when it comes to recognizing God's work in our circumstances and giving Him praise?

Children: (K-5th Grade)

1. How did God prove His power to the Egyptians?
2. What animal did the Israelites kill at Passover? (a lamb)
3. Who is known as the Lamb of God? (See John 1:29.)
4. Do you trust God? Why or why not?

Preschool:

1. Which of the ten plagues sounds the worst to you
2. What might you think about as you walked through the Red Sea on dry ground?
